Section 1. Core Committee Overview

1.1 Committee Charter Statement

Core Committee maintains that students require both college and career readiness and that the transition from high school to college is critical to students. The committee will ensure that students are academically prepared for postsecondary success in college and careers.

- Develop a process which captures conversations between college and high school faculty, particularly definitions of college readiness in academic areas, so that this knowledge can be institutionalized.
